How we're solving it

The Neurodiversity Directory acts as a digital town square - or, put another way, a centralised nodal hub in the neurodiversity network - where individuals can directly access the support, services, and solutions available to them from the neurodiversity sector.



Who we serve

The neurodiversity sector

We serve the companies, organisations and individuals within the neurodiversity sector that provide services to neurodivergent individuals that need - and want - to provide them to MORE individuals; that are proud to own and display a listing on The Neurodiversity Directory in order to be more accessible than they would be without one.



Who we serve

Those affected by neurodivergence

We serve those that need - and want - support, that can afford the support, once they've found their fit and contacted their listing; as, unfortunately - in 2025 and beyond - no genuine support for neurodivergent individuals can be accessed for free from the companies, organisations and individuals that provide them.



What even is the Directory?

A hub where **those affected by neurodivergence** can explore and connect with:

- Assessments & accommodations
- Coaches, consultants, counsellors, therapists and practitioners
- Sensory solutions, clothes and toys
- Solutions and support for neurodiversity in the workplace and in education
- Solutions and support for neurodivergent parents or parents with neurodivergent children
- Neurodiversity networks, charities, speakers and communities



How it all works

Those affected by neurodivergence, when exploring and accessing support, should find doing so easy and frictionless; so, we designed the Directory that way. It works by:

1. Those within the neurodiversity sector creating a listing so that they can be found
2. Those affected by neurodivergence exploring the Directory to discover a good fit for them
3. Connections happen instantly - no-strings, gatekeeping or middlemen - with individuals able to contact the owner of each listing with one click



What can you do to help us?

The neurodiversity sector

- Claim or create your listing to be more visible and accessible than you currently are; you may also wish to offer a unique discount to those who initially contact you through the Directory - we actively encourage this as a gesture of accessibility and goodwill.
